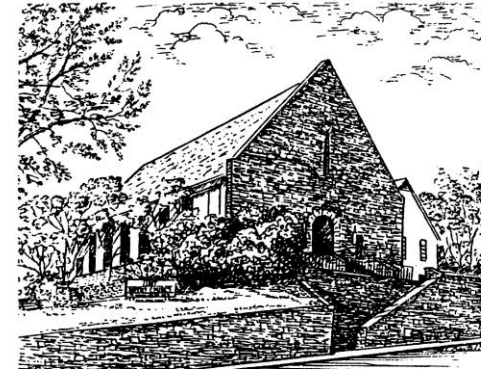
The flowers that grace the sanctuary this morning are from the wedding of Casey Collins and Mason Harris, who were married June 29.
