**Roger Williams is coming to Tryon** - Roger Williams, the founder of the very first Baptist church in America, First Baptist Church of Providence, RI, was a staunch advocate for religious liberty and the separation of church and state. (He also founded the state of Rhode Island.) Even though Williams died in 1683, he's planning a trip to First Baptist Church of Tryon. The Rev. Robert Randolph, retired pastor and chaplain from the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, will present an in-character monologue of Roger Williams during worship on **June 29**.

**Adult and Youth Sunday School** will meet in the Activity Building during July. Because we are exploring significant passages of the Old Testament in worship, we will use this time to explore the Ten Commandments.

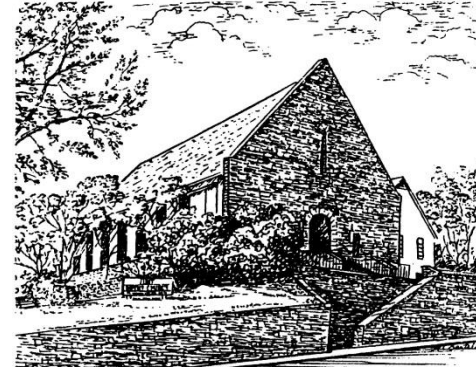
