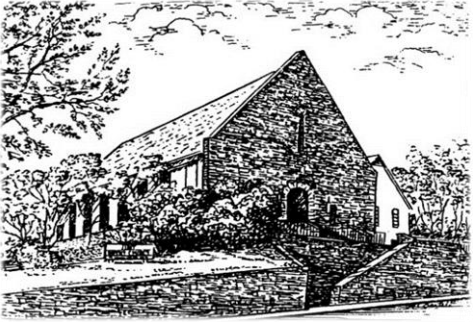
S.E.E. and Children's Choir are scheduled to start at 5pm on Sunday, January 22.
