

Chat With the Preacher

Most days I enjoy being a pastor. After all, in what other vocation is one expected to think and talk about such an extravagant thing as God? But like all vocations, ministry has its ups and downs. There are days and seasons that are hard and there are those that are beautiful and exhilarating.

"Pastoring" is a vocation better experienced than explained. I can tell you what it is like to rub ashes on someone's forehead while saying, "You are dust and to dust you shall return." But unless you've done it, you can't fully understand the humbling holiness of such a moment. I can tell you about conversations with a dying person, and how the closeness of death removes pretension and trivia from the room. But unless you've shared those words and held those hands it is hard to grasp the sacredness of the situation.

There are days, however, when you wonder why in the world you chose this kind of life. Superficiality and shallowness rear their ugly heads and you feel like everything you do is in vain. Lack of commitment to the life and ministry of the local church makes you question your sanity. And you can't help but think there are some church folks who wouldn't recognize Jesus if he hit them in the head with a hammer. That's usually when it occurs to me that there are plenty of times in my own life, when I don't recognize Jesus either, and I'm a trained professional. (Professional, by the way, doesn't necessarily mean that you are particularly skilled at something, it simply means you get paid.)

And that's when I remember that I didn't really choose this kind of life; instead, this kind of life chose me. Or to say it a different way, I believe that God called me to this kind of life. To some that sounds like an arrogant claim, and to others it sounds completely ridiculous. I understand both perspectives. But somehow, when Paul says to the Corinthians (I Corinthians 1:27) that God chose the foolish to shame the wise and the weak to shame the strong then it all seems totally believable to me—that God actually chooses people like you and me to be God's representatives in the world.

There are people and occasions that solidify God's choosing, and I must say that you are such people, and that your support and generosity during my Doctor of Ministry journey is such an occasion. You have supported and affirmed me in this endeavor from day one and I cannot adequately thank you. The abundance of your recent love offering is beyond generous, and I want you to know that I am grateful. I am grateful for your support and affirmation. I am grateful for your friendship. I am grateful that God has called us together for ministry. Now don't go and get the "big head" but you really are a wonderful congregation! I look forward to what God has in store for us.
