Chat With the Preacher

Baptism and Communion are our two most important practices. Whenever we participate in these acts we are participating in the very life of God.

According to St. Paul, baptism allows an opportunity to participate in Christ's death and resurrection, so that we too, "might walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4). But participation in Christ's death and resurrection does not mean that the minister holds you under the water long enough to drown, with the hopes of bringing you back to life via CPR (my feeble attempt at humor). In other words, this is not literal language. You don't literally die, and you aren't literally resurrected. The waters of baptism are not magical; they produce no metaphysical change. But this doesn't mean that the water isn't holy and sacred, or that baptism is "just some symbol." There is more happening than meets the eye.

The Lord's Supper is also more than "just some symbol." We know the wine (or in our case Welch's) is not literally the blood of Christ, and the bread is not

literally the body of Christ, but the bread is more than bread, and the wine is more than wine. St. Paul offers this declarative question, "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ?" (I Corinthians 10:16-17). When we share the Lord's Supper, we are, in some mysterious way, sharing in the very life of Christ. Communion (hence the name) happens when we share this Meal.

These two ancient practices of the Church strengthen and sustain us. They bind us to one another and to God. So I hope you'll join us Sunday as we participate in the life of God through the celebration of baptism and The Lord's Supper. You'll want to be here to support and affirm Katie Cothran as she is baptized, and you'll want to join with Christians across the globe at the Lord's Table to share World Communion Sunday.

I'm looking forward to Sunday.
