

The Christmas Story --The Main Character?

Who is the central figure or main character in the Christmas Story?

That's easy to answer!

The angels: They appear everywhere in the story. They appeared to Zechariah and Elizabeth to announce the birth of John the Baptist. They appeared to Joseph and Mary to announce the birth of Jesus. Angels appeared to the shepherds to tell the great news that Jesus was born and where to find Him. The central figures in the story are angels.

No...not the angels, but...

John the Baptist: An angel foretold John's birth before Jesus' birth announcement to Mary and Joseph. An angel told Zechariah of the birth of John, his son. The angel told him that John was chosen to "make ready a people prepared for the Lord". John is the main character of the story because he prepared us for Jesus' birth, Jesus' life, Jesus' baptism and Jesus' ministry.

No...not John the Baptist, but...

Gabriel explained, "Don't be afraid Mary; God has shown you His grace. Listen! You will become pregnant and give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be

great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give Him the throne of King David, his ancestor, He will rule over the people of Jacob forever, and his kingdom will never end. The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will cover you. For this reason the baby will be holy and will be called the Son of God." Field of Hope Project

There are many indicators around us that our neighbors need help providing enough food for their families. In our schools, we have the highest percentage of students participating in the free and reduced lunch programs. At Thermal Belt Outreach, a significant number of new applicants for assistance have qualified for help.

The mission organizations of our church including the WMU, the Brotherhood and the Sisterhood have committed to help with the Field of Hope Project in an effort to raise produce to be distributed to feed the hungry. We appreciate the offer of the Burrell Family to use farmland to raise potatoes this coming season.

Presently we are creating a list of volunteers needed for two workdays. We will need a large team for <u>planting in April</u> and again on **Harvest Day 120** days later. **Fields of Hope** began in Madison County and welcomes our involvement in the project. Our crop will be about a month ahead of their Harvest Day because of the different weather conditions.

Our harvest will be shared with local food banks and distributed through MANNA, Mountain Area Nutritional Needs Association.

First Baptist Church of Tryon has a long history of supporting the food bank at Thermal Belt Outreach. **Fields of Hope** is another way we can help each other.
